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**Egypt Deluxe 13 Days/ 12 Nights**

**. 13 Sept. 2010:**

Arrival at Cairo Airport, Meet, Assist & Transfer to the 5 star Hotel in Cairo.

"Overnight in Cairo"

**. 14 Sept. 2010:**

After Breakfast, Start your full day visiting the **Egyptian museum** one of the most famous museums, filled with a magnificent collection of antiques including; Mummies, Sarcophagi and fabulous treasures of TUT ANKH AMUN's tomb .Over 250,000 genuine artifacts are presented, including an exhibit dedicated to the Tut-Ankh- Amun collection of treasures, gold, and jewelry, as it was enclosed in his tomb for over 3,500 years before it was discovered in the 1920s when his tomb was excavated. The visit is followed by a visit to the **Great Pyramids** - Cheops, Chephren & Mykerions - & **Sphinx** . Cheops is the most colossal ever built. Next is a close-up look at Sphinx - a huge funeral complex guarded by the legendary lion. Take a **camel journey** into the desert and watch the light reveal the ancient Sphinx and Pyramids including Lunch.

**. 15 Sept. 2010:**

After Breakfast , We start by visiting **Citadel** One of Cairo's most popular tourist attractions is the Citadel which houses a number of museums, ancient mosques and other sites, located on a spur of limestone that had been detached from its parent Moqattam Hills by quarrying. The Citadel is one of the world's greatest monuments to medieval warfare, as well as a highly visible landmark on Cairo's eastern skyline. Particularly when viewed from the back side (from the north), the Citadel reveals a very medieval character. Today the Citadel is one of Egypt main attractions and is often the most popular non-pharaonic monuments. One may walk through time here, from the medieval era onward. In addition, many other wonderful Islamic structures are nearby. For those with a little extra energy, a walk from the Citadel to the Khan el-Khalili is a delightful experiences.

And **Mohamed Ali alabaster Mosque** was built on the site of old Mamluk buildings in Cairo's Citadel between 1830 and 1848, although not completed until the reign of Said Pasha in 1857. The architect was Yusuf Bushnak from Istanbul and its model was the Yeni Mosque in that city. The ground on which the mosque was erected was built with debris from the earlier buildings of the Citadel. Mohamed Ali Pasha was buried in a tomb carved from Carrara marble, in the courtyard of the mosque. His body was transferred here from Hawsh al-Basha in 1857.

Then visit followed by a visit to **Memphis** the ancient capital of Egypt where Colossal Statue of Ramses II and the great Alabaster Sphinx., and to **Sakkara** is 27-Km Southwest of Cairo. Including a visit to the step Pyramids of Sakkara, the first proper Pyramids built for the king Zoser, it is considered evolution of the Pyramid from the simple Mastaba to the Pyramid in its known form ,Including Lunch .

## **. 16 Sept. 2010:**

After breakfast , Travel to Alexandria by A/C bus .  
Arrival Alexandria , tour to visit **Catacomb** of Kom El-Shoqafa ,Tombs on three levels, also contains The Triclinium where relatives used to sit on stone benches to feast the dead, a center with relieves of bearded serpents.  
Inside there are 2nd Century AD statues of Sobec & Anubis wearing Roman Armor), Then visit Bombi Pillar one of the beautiful monuments in the city of Alexandria,was built as a commemoration of the Emperor Deghdianos , and it was taken originally from the

temple of Serapis, which was at a certain time , a great building that competed Alssouma and Alcizariom.

Then to:

**The Citadel** which is considered one of the most important defensive strongholds, not only in Egypt, but also along the Mediterranean Sea coast. It formulated an important part of the fortification system of Alexandria in the 15th century A.D and is situated at the entrance of the eastern harbour on the eastern point of the PharosQaitbay Citadel Island. It was erected on the exact site of the famous Lighthouse of Alexandria, which was one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World.

**Abu Elabas Mosque** which Founded in 1307; rebuilt many times & present building dates from 1775; substantially renovated 1943 Located On Midan el Masaged (Mosque Square) overlooking the eastern harbor, Alexandria, Egypt.

**Alexandria Library** Most famous library of classical antiquity. It was part of the Alexandrian Museum, a research institute at Alexandria, Egypt. The museum and library were founded and maintained by a succession of Ptolemies from the early 3rd century BC. The library aspired to the ideal of an international library — incorporating all Greek literature and also translations into Greek — but it is uncertain how close this ideal came to being realized. A bibliography of the library compiled by Callimachus, lost in the Byzantine period, was long a standard reference work. The museum and library were destroyed in civil war in the late 3rd century AD; a subsidiary library was destroyed by Christians in AD 391.

And **Montazah Palace** which is situated 25 km from Alexandria train station , This palace was started by Khedive Abbas II in 1892, who built a large palace inside the complex called the Salamlek. In 1932, King Fuad built a larger palace and called it the Haramlik. His son, King Farouk, built a bridge to the sea to act as a water front. This is a wonderful spot to enjoy the beauty of Alexandria.

During the tour we can take our lunch & transfer back to Cairo and overnight.

**. 17 Sept. 2010:**

Transfer To The Airport To Depart To Aswan .

Arrival Aswan Airport , Transfer to 5 star Cruise  
Lunch on Board , Sail on the Nile By Felucca around Agha Khan Mausoleum and Kitchner's island which was given to Lord Kitchener as a thank-you for his services in the Sudan Campaign (1896-1898). Nowadays, the island as a whole constitutes a botanical garden. It is particularly popular among the local people and tourists as a spot for weekend picnics or for a quiet afternoon away from the noise of the city. It can be reached by felucca, motorboat or one of local ferries.  
Then, afternoon Tea & take the dinner on Board and enjoy the Nubian Folkloric show

### . 18 Sept. 2010:

Breakfast on Board  
Starting our tour to visit:

**The High Dam** which was completed in 1964, The dam's completion permitted downstream reclamation of 675,000 acres and the conversion of an additional one million acres to perennial irrigation. Twelve electric turbines initially provided 60 percent of Egypt's electrical needs, but economic growth has reduced this percentage. Increased use of irrigation without adequate drainage has caused waterlogging and salinization downstream. The dam has also been criticized for causing a variety of other adverse environmental consequences.

**The Temple of Philae** which lies in south of the city of Aswan. Its main temple was dedicated to the goddess *Isis* and its construction was undertaken during the third century B.C. Philae was the last bastion of ancient Egyptian religion and hieroglyphic usage. It is also a superb example of threatened cultural heritage being saved in the face of modern civilization's march to change the environment.

And **Unfinished Obelisk** is situated on the southern edge of Aswan town in the Northern quarry and is being promoted as a tourist attraction in an attempt to attract more visitors to the Aswan area. The basic shape of the obelisk was hewn out by workers pounding out the shape using dolomite rocks and creating a one meter trench around the perimeter in the shape of the obelisk.

Then sail To Kom Ombo and have our Lunch on Board.  
Continue our tour by visiting the **Temple of Kom Ombo** which stands on high grounds overlooking the Nile. It differs from other

temples by its double entrance, each of which is dedicated to divinity: "**Haroeris**" with his falcon head and "**Sobec**" with his crocodile head. Although Kom Ombo is a small village, its importance lies in its huge sugar-cane.

Then Sail To Edfu , Afternoon tea  
Captain's Welcome Cocktail "Smart Casual attire"  
Dinner on Board and Disco.

### . 19 Sept. 2010:

Breakfast on Board , Visit **Horus Temple** In Edfu which located between Aswan and Luxor is located - the best preserved major temple in Egypt. The temple is dedicated to the falcon god *Horus* and was built over a 180-year period from 237 BC to 57 BC. Inside the temple's pylons is a large courtyard. Just before the entrance to the first of two hypostyle halls is a welcoming statue of *Horus*. Inside the hypostyle halls are dominated by a forest of towering columns. Followed by sailing to Luxor.  
Lunch On Board , afternoon tea ,Dinner on board and enjoy the night with Galabeya.

### . 20 Sept. 2010:

After Breakfast, Disembark from the Cruise and transfer to 5 Star hotel in Luxor

Check in the hotel, and then Visit the West Bank:

**The Valley Of The Kings** in Upper Egypt contains many of the tombs of pharaohs New Kingdom, including *Tutankhamun* and *Ramesses the Great*. The Valley of the Kings actually has two components - the East Valley and the West Valley. It is the East Valley which most tourists visit and in which most of the tombs of the New Kingdom Pharaohs can be found.

**Valley of the Queens**, It contains more than 80 tombs of queens, princes, and princesses of the Eighteenth, Nineteenth and Twentieth Dynasties.

**The Temple Of Queen Hatshepsut** at El-Deir El-Bahari ,  
Hateshepsut sits atop a series of colonnaded terraces, reached by

long ramps that once were graced with gardens. It is built into a cliff face that rises sharply above it, and is largely considered to be one of the "incomparable monuments of ancient Egypt" It is 97 feet (30 m) tall. The unusual form of Hatshepsut's temple is explained by the choice of location, in the valley basin of Deir el-Bahri, surrounded by steep cliffs. It was here, in about 2050 BC that Mentuhotep II, the founder of the Middle Kingdom, laid out his sloping, terrace-shaped mortuary temple.

**And The Colossi Memnon**, The twin statues depict Amenhotep III (fl. 14th century BC) in a seated position, his hands resting on his knees and his gaze facing eastwards (actually SSE in modern bearings) towards the river. Two shorter figures are carved into the front throne alongside his legs: these are his wife Tiy and mother Mutemwiya. The side panels depict the Nile god Hapy.

Followed by visiting to **Karnak Temple** the complex is a vast open-air museum and the largest ancient religious site in the world & is famous for its 134 massive columns arranged in 16 rows in the Hypostyle Hall.

and on the east bank of the Nile at Luxor lies the magnificent **Luxor Temple** which was dedicated to the great god Amun-Re, his wife Mut and their son Khonsu - together representing the Theban triad.

### **. 21 Sept. 2010:**

The departure from hotel is about 07.45.00A.M & Transfer from Luxor hotel By A/C Coach to Hurghada  
At 12.00- Noon Time - Arriving Hurghada and transfer To 5 star Hotel

Hurghada which is one of the famous and biggest places to spend a holiday on the Red Sea. Hurghada is nowadays place where you definitely have to go when you visit Red Sea or Egypt.
